engaged through vital outreach efforts, ensuring critical resources and support.

295 Clients

served through our Syringe Services Program, the only one of its kind in the county.

Over **4,000**

doses of Narcan are distributed, actively preventing overdoses and saving lives.

33,590 Syringes

were exchanged, reducing the risk of HIV transmission and other health complications.

250 HIV Kits

for at-home testing and **4,200 condoms** distributed to protect and educate.

145 Volunteers

dedicated **600 hours** to supporting our mission.

People

educated through **35 LGBTQ+** competency training, fostering inclusion and understanding.
